#### Discussion – Defeated School Budget

Mr. Sarclette stated the Township Committee has reviewed the defeated school budget resolution and felt adopting it would be the right thing to do in light of the fact that seven teachers are being cut and the school is increasing its shared services activities including the services of their superintendent. He recommended the Township Committee approve the defeated school budget as the County Superintendent would probably uphold it because the school budget is under "CAP".

Mr. Gordon Gross OEM Coordinator, reported the Township has received \$29,400.00 plus from FEMA to cover Township expenses from the storms of December 20, 2009 and February 5 & 6, 2010. However, the Township may not receive the actual dollars for six months to one-year because of Trenton holding onto the money once they receive it from FEMA.

Also, Mr. Gross stated 12 – 15 township residents have applied to the County for FEMA help with the massive March rainstorm.

The Township and OEM have submitted a bill to Mays Landing Sand & Gravel for \$22,600.00 plus to cover our expenses incurred during the dike breach in late March. Mays Landing Sand & Gravel has approved payment of this amount and will send the check out with the next billing cycle.

In other matters, Mr. Gross noted he will be attending a table top drill on June 1 which will develop a plan to react to Union Lake dam bursting should it ever occur.

Mr. Gross expressed his frustration with a local resident submitting numerous OPRA requests, sometimes two a day, and the time township employees must expend to respond to these requests.

Mr. Jud Moore, Fire Chief, Port Elizabeth Vol. Fire Co., reminded the Township Committee that a commitment is needed from the Township to pay for electric for the proposed traffic light at Route 47 & Port Elizabeth-Cumberland Road. Mr. Sarclette replied that the plan is to have the electric for this light tied in to the Port Elizabeth firehouse. The Fire Company is willing to pay for this. There will also be a pedestrian switch at this location. The State will not reveal its final plans until a letter of support from the Township is received. Ultimately, the Township will end up paying the electric bill for the light. Mr. Sarclette expressed concern as to how the new light will affect the Port Elizabeth Post Office.

Also, Mr. Moore referred to a possible grant from the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture to re-roof the former Delmont Fire House roof. Does the Township committee wish to apply for funding for the roof replacement only? If an economic impact initiative grant is received, it will comprise of a 75% grant and 25% loan. Mr. Sarclette indicated his intent to speak with Mr. Schellinger to get his input on the project.

Mr. Sarclette referred to a request from Governor Christie for support for his "Tool Kit". He has no issues with endorsing his support but wanted input from the Township Committee.

Mr. George Kumor signified his disappointment that our ratio is 97% even after the recent revaluation. (Actually, the 2010 ratio is 99.59%.) The Township should look at sales in the future to see if properties sell for less than the new assessments. Perhaps we should approach the County to see if our new assessments are too high. A new revaluation should result in our ratio increased to 100%. Per Mr. Kumor, those who are trying to "flip" properties may have skewed the ratio.

#### First Public Comments Session

Mrs. Ireland made a motion to open the first public comment session, seconded by Mr. Langley.

Mr. Jim Yondura, Leesburg, stated he found a notice in his door from the dog census contractor, Countywide Animal Control, regarding unlicensed dogs. It noted two dogs were seen in the window barking. Mr. Yondura asked if the dog census workers can go into his property and can they look into his window? Mr. DiDomenico stated they can't peer into his windows but if dogs appear in a window as one approaches a house, this can't be considered "peering". The Township has sent a letter to Countywide stating that "no trespassing" signs emplaced by residents should be respected and, as an alternative, notices should be sent by mail.

Mr. Wayne Reeves, Milmay, expressed opposition to the proposed 41¢ increase in local property taxes. Mr. Sarclette replied the Township Committee introduced the budget in accordance with statute. The Township is approaching the state for transitional aid. We probably won't know the outcome until June. His guess is a \$2.42/C rate for 2010 but all factors have to come into play. The Township Committee is constantly working on the budget to fine tune it. He further stated that Pinelands issues and lack of prison parity funding are other factors which could make a difference in the rate.

Mr. Tom Swayne, Heislerville, thanked Mrs. Lloyd and the township employees for taking the time to explain things to him.

Mrs. Elaine Buffa, Leesburg, noted the City of Millville is closing the Municipal Hall and employees are being furloughed. Why can't Maurice River Township do the same? Our tax rate is astronomical. We need to adopt a better budget. Why can't the hall be closed one day a week. Also, why can't the Township Committee take a pay cut? Mr. Sarclette responded that the Township Committee is taking everything into consideration. Mrs. Buffa said she would like to see an analysis on closing one day per week.

Mr. George Kumor, Heislerville, asked what bridge was involved with the request for "no fishing" signs to be emplaced at?

Mr. Jack Kontes, Port Elizabeth, stated he was alarmed at a recent news article in the Press which reported on the Maurice River Township budget. He suggested the Township Committee review such articles for accuracy before they are printed. Based on the articles, he asked if it would be advisable for him to improve his property? What is the Township doing to bring in more revenue besides depending on property taxes? He would like to meet with the Township on new ideas to increase sources of revenue. New ideas are needed now. We can't wait for the Governor to send us money. Mr. Sarclette replied that the State has given us less and less over time not to mention recurring issues with CAFRA, Pinelands, etc. The Township does have an economic development committee. Unfortunately, environmental programs bring in minimal revenue.

Mr. Jim Yondura asked if the Township can restrict purchase of lands by tax-exempt entities? The Clerk recounted how this was attempted several years ago when Assemblyman Doug Fisher was given the task of drafting parameters for proposed legislation which would require tax exempt entities to pay full tax on future purchases in municipalities who already had over 50% of their lands tax exempt. However, Mr. Fisher caved in to pressure from environmental groups to the point that when the final parameters were drawn, only two municipalities in South Jersey would have qualified. Interestingly, both of these municipalities just happened to be in Mr. Fishers' voting district. Mr. Oliver stated that what we need are legislators in Trenton with backbone.

Mr. George Kumor questioned our sales ratio since most recent sales within the township were below the new assessed values. We should also petition the Governor to pay Maurice River Township for tax-exempt land.

Mr. Robert Barron, Port Elizabeth, asked if the Township has any statutes pertaining to trailers, children, and the cost to the Township of maintaining the trailers. Mr. Sarclette countered that we cannot discriminate against these folks. Also, he has been in contact with the liaison to the Governor. The Township Committee will look into setting up an ad hoc committee. We need individuals to write to legislators.

Mr. Joe Haney, Port Elizabeth, stated the drainage problems on Ellen Lane has been fixed. It took a call from the Township Committee to our senators to get the freeholders to fix the problem, but he appreciates the Township Committee going to bat for him.

Sgt. Petrillo noted the bike patrols will be reactivated during summer. The traffic safety unit will be active on Routes 347, 47 and 55.

Officer Petrillo encouraged residents to be the eyes and ears for the State Police. Also, parents should educate their children to respect property and the rights of others.

### **2010 Budget/Public Hearing**

The Mayor introduced our auditor, Ray Colavita, CPA who gave a brief synopsis of the 2010 budget as it now stands. He explained that in 16 of 17 years past, we have received extraordinary aid. Last year we received \$250,000.00. Historically, the state is late in giving out financial aid. The township has lost pinelands municipal aid which we had received for a seven-year stretch averaging \$105,000.00 per year. This funding has dried up as has Garden State Preservation funding to some degree. We also received a \$150,000.00 special purpose

grant (one time) in 2005. Mr. Colavita added that we can estimate the tax based on the new assessments, but we don't know what the final rate will be. The budget was introduced in April. More information is still coming in.

Mr. Colavita added that the township committees have had many meetings with our legislators over the years to get funding. Accordingly, we will try to set up a meeting again this year. Mr. Colavita urged the public to "stay cool" for a few months until more information comes in. He reminded the public that the Township committee is only responsible for the local purpose tax which represents about 10% of their total tax bill.

Mrs. Ireland made a motion to open the public hearing for the 2010 budget; motion seconded by Mr. Langley.

Mr. Wayne Reeves, Milmay, stated his new assessment has increased by 150%. Mr. Sarclette clarified that the estimated 41¢ increase is based on the old assessment values.

Mr. Roger Brode, Milmay, stated the reporter for the Press should have been corrected on his erroneous reporting. However, we should not cut services at the Township. He added that the Township employees are doing "a hell of a good job."

Mr. Jim Yondura, Leesburg, asked if we are looking into shared services? Mr. Sarclette replied that we currently have several shared service agreements with the school and county.

Mr. Yondura wondered why Camden is still getting prison funding when the prison there has been closed?

Mr. Preston Hoffman, Leesburg, noted the money to operate the Township comes from the homeowners. We can't continue to rely on this source of income. We have nothing to offer industry to relocate here. He indicated the sexual predator unit should have been taken in years past when it was available. The Township has missed the boat on some opportunities.

Mr. Tom Swayne, Heislerville, asked what percentage of the budget was earmarked for salary and wages? He also questioned the "steps" denoted in the salary ordinance and was confused as to the salary paid to the municipal deputy clerk.

1. Status of Carlisle Place Road Phase III – Mr. Schellinger reported that plans had been sent to NJDOT and these have been approved. We should advertise to receive bids next month and award once funds are available.
2. Status of East Point Berm – Mr. Schellinger noted that this project is being redesigned; gabions will no longer be used but instead a berm will be built.
3. Status of New Fuel Tanks – Mr. Schellinger noted no changes since last months report.
4. Status of Thompson's Beach Restoration – Mr. Schellinger stated we are waiting on US Army Corp. of Engineers permit. This is currently under review. Thompson's Beach road is to be filled in with concrete from the beach. AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MAURICE RIVER, COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE RECONSTRUCTION OF CARLISLE PLACE ROAD - PHASE III IN THE AMOUNT OF \$208,000

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Maurice River, County of Cumberland, State of New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of the full membership thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

SECTION 1. The Township Council hereby authorizes for the purpose set forth in Section 3 of this ordinance an appropriation in the amount of \$208,000.

SECTION 2. For the financing of the cost of said purpose, the Township Committee has received approval of an allotment in the amount of \$170,000 under the New Jersey Transportation Trust Fund Authority Act. In addition thereto, there is hereby authorized the expenditure of \$38,000 from the Capital Improvement Fund.

SECTION 3. The purpose herein referred to and hereby authorized and the purpose of the financing is as follows:

Reconstruction of Carlisle Place Road - PH 3\$208,000

SECTION 4. It is hereby found, determined and declared that:

A. The purpose described in Section 3 is not a current expense and is an improvement which the Township of Maurice River may lawfully make as general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been made or shall be specifically assessed on property especially benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the purpose authorized by this ordinance is 10 years.

C. No debt is authorized by this ordinance.

D. The aggregate amount included in the estimated cost of the improvements or purposes for accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, fees, preliminary planning, test and survey expenses, and a reasonable proportion of the compensation and expenses of employees of the Township of Maurice River in connection with the construction or acquisition of such improvements or property shall not exceed \$38,000.

SECTION 5. The New Jersey Transportation Trust Authority Act has approved a grant for the reconstruction of Carlisle Place Road in the amount of \$170,000. The amount received under the New Jersey Transportation Trust Authority Act will be utilized for payment of expenditures or for the reimbursement of expenses paid.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage as provided by law.

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Transportation requires a resolution of commitment from Maurice River Township agreeing to participate in cost sharing associated with the requested traffic control device;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of Maurice River Township, that the Township agrees as follows:

- a) The Township agrees to participate in cost sharing for the traffic control signal to be located at New Jersey Route 47 and Port Elizabeth-Cumberland Road.
- b) The Township understands that this commitment requires the Township to be responsible for the payment of annual electric service and annual energy cost for the requested traffic control signal.
- c) The Township understands that should there be any further cost to be incurred by the Township, the Township will be advised by the New Jersey Department of Transportation, Bureau of Traffic Signal and Safety Engineering.
- d) The current school speed limit sign with flashers along New Jersey Route 47 southbound will be relocated to a new location in advance of the intersection to minimize a potential conflict with the proposed traffic signal.
- e) There shall be no changes made with regards to the existing school speed limit sign with flashers located along New Jersey Route 47 northbound.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Committee of Maurice River Township concurs and is in agreement with the relocation of the flashing school speed limit sign currently located along New Jersey Route 47 southbound.
